

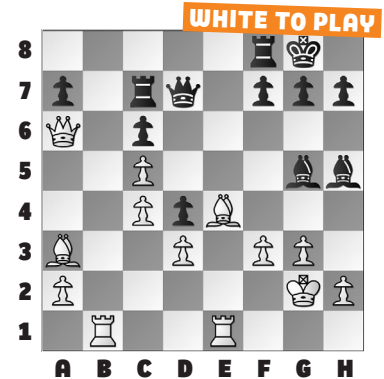
NATIONAL K-12 GRADES, PT. 2

This week's puzzles again come from the **2024 National K-12 Grade Championships**. Even on the top boards, overlooking one forcing

move can be the difference between a win and a loss.

In our **example**, we see an instance of this when White decided to overcomplicate things in their rush to win the c6-pawn with **27. Rb7?? Rxb7 28. Bxc6** intending to regain the full rook. But White had overlooked **28. ... Rb6!** when Black remains Exchange-up after **29. cxb6 Qxc6** with an attack to boot. White resigned just six moves later. Instead, something patient like 27.

f4 kept level chances, as the c6-pawn was a long-term weakness.

SOLUTIONS

1) 67. ... Nf1+ Black forces mate-in-two! **68. Kh3 Rh2** mate. (Xia – Karthi, Maryland, 2024) **2) 38. Nb6+** The discovered attack threatens nothing... except a fork after Nb6-d5! **38. ... Kxd3 39. Nd5 Bd8 40. Nxe7 Bxe7 41. Rc7** The rook is ready with Rc7-d7 to keep the passed pawn in check. (Kaplan – Oh, Maryland, 2024) **3) 22. Qh5** White threatens mate on f7 as well as forking the king with the hanging e4-knight.

22. ... Ne2+ Or **22. ... Qe8 23. Rf7** repeats the question. **23. Qxe2** White must take, since **23. Kh1?? N4xg3+** **24. hxg3 Nxg3+** wins the queen! But now White is piece-up. (Vinod – Cortez, Maryland, 2024) **4) 23. Bxa6** The b-pawn is overloaded! **23. ... Re4** White had to be precise after **23. ... bxa6 24. Qxa6+ Kd7** and find **25. Rxc6!! Qxc6 26. Qa7+** when the d4-rook hangs. **24. Bxb7+** Not the only win, but the most precise. **24. ... Kd8 25. Qd3+** The

engine says mate-in-nine, so **Black resigned** after **25. ... Ke8**. (Liu – Lee, Maryland, 2024) **5) 35. ... Rd1** The f1-knight is short on squares! **36. Ne3** The X-ray defense with **36. Bb5** lost immediately to **36. ... Rxf1** mate. **36. ... Rd2+** Kings are poor defenders. (Mukherjee – Wang, Maryland, 2024) **6) 22. Nxd5** Tactics with equal trades are tricky! **22. ... cxd5 23. Bb3** The b2-rook is trapped. **23. ... Ba3 24. Bc1** White won shortly. (Underwood – Bhandari, Maryland, 2024)
